If you are interested in the anatomy of a true Community Partnership, look no further than our Habitat homes. Our 3 spring houses involve 8 Methodist churches, 7 Baptist churches, 3 colleges, 2 high schools, 2 Decatur industrial plants (Bunge & BP Amoco), 2 grants, the Rotary Club of Decatur Daybreak, the ReStore, and Habitat homeowners! Sponsorships include monetary contributions, building materials and volunteer labor to build the homes. Now under construction:

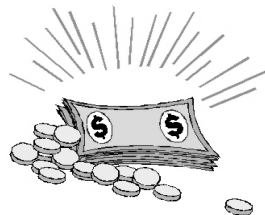

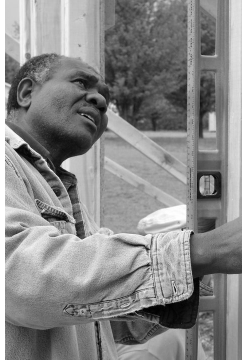

We have just what you need to get in shape for swimsuit season: a **Bowflex Revolution** and a gym quality **Stair-master**...and the price is right!

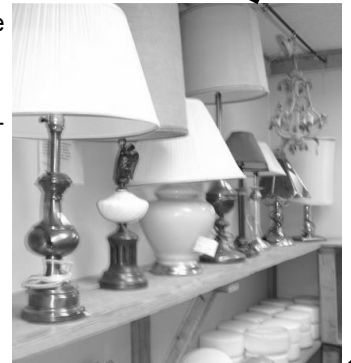
The **lighting** area has been revamped and is easier to shop.
